Alianza is the only alliance in the Coachella Valley bringing together community members, nonprofits, and government to lead efforts we need for a thriving region. Previously known as Building Healthy Communities, our expanding work is built around leadership development and an understanding that healthy and economically prosperous communities exist only when our population is represented in all decisions impacting our daily lives. That is why we work to make people active players in the processes shaping policies and public funding priorities.

Alianza recognizes that the vitality of our region is deeply interconnected and that a thriving Eastern Coachella Valley benefits the whole valley — east and west. We focus in the city of Coachella and the unincorporated communities of Thermal, Mecca, Oasis, and North Shore near the northwest shore of the Salton Sea. These communities are predominantly Latino with a rich history and culture too often overshadowed by economic disadvantages. People farm the fields that help feed the nation, yet they live in substandard housing, drink tainted water, and struggle to feed their own families. Amid these challenges, pride in community cohesiveness and parents' aspirations of a better life for their children fuel hope in the Eastern Coachella Valley.

The concentration of low-income residents in the Eastern Coachella Valley creates significant barriers to self-determination and access to basic resources and services. Communities in the east face a lack of

With Alianza's support, people in the Eastern Coachella Valley are:

- bringing parks, paved roads, and public transportation to marginalized neighborhoods
- improving local community representation on the region's water district board
- connecting neighbors to affordable health services
- bringing a more positive learning environment into schools
- planning new culturally inclusive community festivals

Since 2010, Alianza (previously Building Healthy Communities Coachella Valley) has helped residents of the Eastern Coachella Valley apply their determined spirit and strong work ethic to campaigns that enrich their community. These are just some of our alliance's many accomplishments.

Clean water for the underserved

 Changed the Coachella Valley Water District from an all at-large board to a district board, helping ensure better minority representation at a government agency serving many disadvantaged areas. In response to residents' concerns, the water district formed the Disadvantaged Community Infrastructure Task Force to work on water quality and service issues.

 Created legislation that was ultimately approved setting new statewide standards for arsenic filtration systems and water billing in mobile home parks.

 Improved air quality in low-income neighborhoods by helping secure funding for paved roads in nearly 40 Eastern Coachella Valley mobile home parks.

Access to health care

 Secured funding to expand an Affordable Care Act health insurance enrollment campaign that reduced the eligible but uninsured population by 45,000.

Support for youth

• Worked with school district leaders to start a pilot project introducing restorative justice at Bobby Duke Middle School in Coachella, before expanding these efforts to four middle schools — giving educators new disciplinary tools that keep students in the classroom.

 Organized two youth-led festivals: The Hue, an annual music and arts celebration, and the Eastern Coachella Valley's first LGBTQ Pride Festival, which is now an annual event.


