Researchers involved in this study will collect interviews with people who have been involved in environmental governance through work in government agencies, community-based organizations, environmental advocacy organizations, environment-focused media, and scientific research. Interviewees will be asked questions about the roles they have played in environmental governance, and about their vision for improved environmental governance. Study researchers will also collect and analyze documentation related to environmental governance (including government and community reports, photographs and video, etc). 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- During and after an interview, you can:

  - ask for all or parts of interview recordings to be taken out of publicly accessible research repositories
  - ask for all or parts of interview recording, and associate notes, to be destroyed
  - ask for your interview data or personal identifiers to be removed from the study’s data set, knowing that we will not be able to retract anything that is already in press or in at the time you submit a retraction request.
  - ask for additional conditions, and have listed these below:
